NEW NAME. NEW VENUE. SAME BIG VISION. YOU, DEAR AUDIENCE MEMBER, ARE PART OF A HISTORIC MOMENT FOR CALGARY'S LONGEST-RUNNING FILM FESTIVAL.

When the Calgary Society of Independent Filmmakers (CSIF) started the festival in 1992 under the name \$100 Film Festival, the focus was on making Super 8 films for under - you guessed it - \$100. In following years, however, the festival shifted its focus from low-budget to quality smallformat films by dropping the budgetary limit and allowing 16mm films. It's fitting that our festival's new name debuts at the same time as our relocation to Theatre Junction GRAND. This beautiful building has seen the likes of Fred Astaire, the Famous Five, and the Marx Brothers walk through its doors throughout its 106 years of existence as first a theatre, a political & social hub, a movie hall, and now a culturehouse. A shared desire to get back to our roots brought us together, and we couldn't be more excited.

In the days that followed, I came back in early morning or evening, when crews were not working, to film the stairwells, the stones, the doors, to stand on the landings, to listen to the sounds of the empty building, to watch the light at the windows, to hear again the songs of this place.

JOSH WEISSBACH / 2017 / USA / 16MM / 8:40

A series of spatial limits are defined while a maker imbibes. Interdependence is inherited after a substance cannot be shook. An animal carefully guards an outlined space as a river runs backwards.

JOSEPHINE MASSARELLA / 2017 / HAMILTON / 16MM / 6:00

Shot in 16mm B&W film using single-frame photography, 165708 employs in-camera techniques and chemical manipulation of processed film to produce an eidetic study of temporal elasticity. Stop motion, timelapse, flicker, tinting and toning, combined with cycles of alternating exposed frames, imbue the work with a rhythmic magnetism, apparent both in the tempo and the aesthetic of the images.

Convolve

COLBY RICHARDSON / 2016 / WINNIPEG / SUPER 8 / 3:20

Shot on Super 8 using all in-camera edits, Convolve uses prisms, water refractions and warped chrome to obscure the already obscured path of The Maze. The score is created live by utilizing an analog-video camera feed of the film as an audio output, creating a perfectly synced, jarring and mesmerizing soundtrack.

Dingbat's Revenge*

Can an experimental animator follow contemporary Hollywood logic? New ideas are out of fashion; everything's a trilogy. Laser-printed onto recycled 16mm film in 2015, Dingbat's Revenge is a coded, stroboscopic manifesto pitched somewhere between abstraction and representation. "Can you feel that? We're done here. Move out of the way or I'm gonna run you over." - Tony Stark.

VISITING ARTIST: John Porter



A filmmaker, performer, photographer and writer since 1968, Toronto's John Porter is one of the most important figures and strongest advocates of Canada's small-gauge film community. He has made over 300 films, mostly super 8, and has performed over 100 solo shows internationally. Energetic and humorous, Porter's films are usually silent, made in series, and can be enjoyed by people of all ages. And, interestingly enough, he only ever screens his original prints.

Along with filmmaking, John has conducted many filmmaking-related workshops and has been actively involved with several artist-run centres in Toronto such as Funnel and Pleasure Dome.

Visiting Artist John Porter will trace a personal history of Super 8 and 8mm production, distribution and exhibition in Canada, beginning in Toronto in the 1960s with artists like Michael Snow and Joyce Wieland. Porter will discuss the radical politics and philosophy of Super 8 projections and distribution, while speculating on the future of Super 8 technology and the current rise of analog and DIY vouth culture.
