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
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


NEAL MOIGNARD is a Calgary based artist who creates animations, videos, interactive installations, and performances that facilitate interaction with colour, texture, pattern, touch, movement, sound, and story. He extends and mixes conventional mediums in order to unearth strange thoughts, feelings, and ideas, while remaining in dialogue with each form's unique vocabulary.

JOE KELLY is a Newfoundland born media artist working in Calgary. He studied film and video at the Quickdraw Animation Society and the Calgary Society of Independent Filmmakers. Working primarily with film and video, on super 8, 16 and 35mm formats, Joe's work has been screened and awarded internationally. STEPHEN BROOMER is a filmmaker and film preservationist. He holds a BFA in Film and Video Production, an MA in Film Studies, and a PhD in Communication & Culture, his dissertation was a study of the origins of the Canadian avant-garde film. He has given public presentations of his film restoration work at the Art Gallery of Ontario and the Canadian Film Institute, and his own films have screened at Views from the Avant-Garde, TIFF Wavelengths and the Berlin Directors Lounge

ARTIST TALK

THE TRANSFORMABLE MOMENT

Thursday Feb 26, 2:00pm | ACAD | Stanford Perrot Lecture Theatre | FREE

Since 2010, filmmaker Stephen Broomer has completed more than 30 films using a range of digital and photochemical techniques. His films range from programmatic studies of spiritual places; to works of found and altered footage; to performative works that play in illusions and disoriented sightlines. All of this work wears its debts to preceding artists and movements of experimental cinema, in Canada and abroad. With this talk, Broomer will address a number of the aesthetic motifs and processes that govern his work, and will place that body of work in the context of a poetic tradition in avant-garde film.

WORKSHOP

HYBRID STRATEGIES FOR FILM & VIDEO

Saturday Feb 28, 10:00am | ACAD | Room 439 | \$80

This workshop will introduce and provide practical skills for artists interested in using video to alter and augment film images. The workshop is offered in two sessions, the first being historical and demonstrative, the second involving practical exercises. Among the topics addressed will be the ways in which video has come to emulate traditional printing processes and the processes by which one might output digital augmentations of film back to celluloid (through re-photography). The central learning goals of this workshop are to train participants to pursue new possibilities for working between mediums.

WALKING ON AYR

Lab Coast + Carl Spencer | Thursday Feb 26

Since 2008, Calgary supergroup Lab Coast has revolved around tunes recorded in various basements by founders David Laing and Chris Dadge. These songs are compact, tightly-wound strings of melody and bustling rhythms.

CARL SPENCER is an artist and teacher working in Calgary, Alberta. His past works have explored various aspects of systems theory and process art through the use of video, sound and projection, with a focus on the modification of electronic devices for use in generative systems of art. He is currently working on several 16mm films and a sound project that involves sending audio via regular mail.



Month of February at UAS +15 Window, Arts Commons (205 8 Ave SE)

For A.T. is a meditation on the cinematic - image, sound, motion and time - as an experiential phenomenon. Images of snow and smoke from chimneys on a grey overcast sky are captured on low contrast film. The resulting image is a slowly decaying loop of ephemeral sepia toned imagery. The image is nearly imperceptible at first, but persevere. *For A.T.* will be exhibited in Untitled Arts Society's +15 window for the month of February.


Noel Bégin: Metalized Precipitation, Seven Billion Individual Diamonds of Untenable


